STRUCTURE

MISSION STATEMENT

The Carolina Junior Hurricanes are committed to developing young athletes through a culture of excellence, accountability, and teamwork. As a comprehensive youth hockey organization offering AAA, AA, and A levels of play, we provide opportunities for players to grow and compete at the level best suited to their development. Our mission is to foster skill advancement, sportsmanship, and respect—on and off the ice—while preparing our players for success both in hockey and in life.

COMPETE. DEVELOP. ADVANCE.

The Carolina Junior Hurricanes are the only program in the Southeast offering both co-ed and girls programming from introductory (Super 8) through the highest levels of youth hockey (Tier I AAA).

Our single birth-year (co-ed) and age group (girls) structure is designed to mirror our competitive peers across the country to provide our members with level and age appropriate competition and player development opportunities.

Our primary focus in the placement of our players via tryouts is to match each and every player with the best fit for their individual growth and progression.

UNDERSTANDING TIERS AND LEVELS

TIER I AAA

Our Tier I AAA program is designed to provide the opportunity for locally-based, level-appropriate players to gain exposure through the highest levels of competition without needing to relocate. Our programming at the younger ages (11U, 12U, 13U & Girls 14U) is designed to prepare area players for the ultra-competitive landscape of older-age AAA hockey. Programming at that level (14U through 18U, Girls 16U & Girls 19U) aims to compete at the highest level nationally.

TIER II

The biggest misconception of Tier II is that it's for players who "don't make" Tier I. Each year, the Junior Canes field nationally-ranked Tier II teams full of players who choose to play Tier II because of the travel, expense or more flexible schedule. We have several alums currently playing collegiate hockey or Junior hockey who never played a game at the Tier I AAA level. We also have many Tier II players who strive to play Tier I hockey who take advantage of our intense approach to player development to reach a level of play where AAA hockey becomes the right level for them.

WHY BLACK, RED & WHITE?

To keep with our approach to providing the right level of competition for each player, the Junior Canes name our teams Black, Red and White instead of "AA" or "A" because it allows for competitive flexibility based on each team. Each year, we field Red and even occasionally White teams that compete at a higher level of competition based on the team's post-tryout roster.

TEAM SERVICE PROJECTS

Each Junior Canes team gives back to the community by participating in a team-led service project each season. Players are encouraged to connect with head coaches of our younger teams and our Super 8 program to build leadership skills, provide meaningful mentorship, and earn volunteer hours on the ice.

ICE PROGRAM

LEAGUE AFFILIATION

While the Junior Canes continue to support the Carolinas Hockey League (CHL) as our primary league partner, many of our traditionally independent teams will be joining leagues to maximize exposure opportunities and ensure the highest level of competition possible.



All Junior Hurricanes Co-ed AAA teams participate in the **TIER I ELITE LEAGUE**, which is a mandatory component of our program. The Tier I Elite League is the premier AAA coed youth hockey league in the United States and provides our athletes with consistent, high-level competition against the top Tier I programs in the country.



This partnership ensures that our athletes compete in a nationally recognized league that supports development, competitive excellence, and opportunities for advancement within the game.

The **NATIONAL GIRLS HOCKEY LEAGUE** is an elite girls hockey league focused on advancement. The nation-wide league features top organizations such as Lovell Academy, Philadelphia Jr Flyers and Team Long Island.

The **CAROLINAS HOCKEY LEAGUE** is a Tier 2 league covering North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia, including Hampton Roads Warriors and Richmond Generals.

The Junior Canes hockey staff will review Tier 2 team rosters post-tryouts to evaluate the best competitive fit for each team, including independent schedules for some of our Black teams.

EVENT / TOURNAMENT SELECTION

All teams receive a set number of tournaments/events. During the start of each season, teams will meet to discuss and propose a plan for tournaments that will be reviewed and approved by our Hockey Director to ensure age, level and cost appropriate selections.

SUPER 8 PROGRAM (for 8U players)

The Super 8 program returns for another year for boys and girls interested in experiencing hockey. A first-come, first-serve open registration program, the Super 8s go through a weekly player development session and compete as Junior Canes 8U teams in three tournaments. Teams can only travel twice outside of the affiliate, and all players must be enrolled in the PPHL or another local house league recreation program. Registration will open up in late Spring, and players will be evaluated in September to place them in level-appropriate training and competitive groups. The purpose of this process is **not** to create "super teams" but to help our staff deliver the most effective player development program.

ENHANCED PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

We prioritize comprehensive player development to ensure each athlete reaches their full potential. Our Director of Player Development, Colin Muldoon, brings extensive experience to the program, having served in this role since 2007. The program offers a return to Player Development (PD) sessions for all teams (with the exception of 18U Black & 18UAAA) throughout the season designed to enhance foundational abilities such as skating, edge work, puck control, passing, and shooting.

HUDL & INSTAT FOR HOCKEY

The Carolina Junior Hurricanes leverage cutting-edge video analysis tools like Hudl and Instat to enhance player development. These platforms provide game film breakdowns, advanced analytics, and scouting tools to help players improve their performance and gain exposure.

COACH RESOURCES: IHS & THE COACHES SITE

Our coaching staff stays at the forefront of hockey development through resources like Ice Hockey Systems (IHS) and The Coaches Site. These platforms provide access to elite-level drills, practice plans, and professional development materials, ensuring our players receive top-tier coaching backed by the latest strategies and techniques.

OFF-ICE PERFORMANCE & STRENGTH DEVELOPMENT

The Junior Canes are committed to supporting the long-term athletic development of our players through a comprehensive off-ice training model. Through partnerships with leading performance providers, athletes receive structured strength and conditioning resources to improve strength, mobility, speed, and durability.

EB Athletics serves as the Junior Canes' primary Tier 1 Strength and Conditioning provider, delivering age-appropriate programming for 9U-18U athletes through the TeamBuildr platform. This program is enhanced through collaboration with Bill Burniston, Head Strength and Conditioning Coach for the Carolina Hurricanes, integrating professional-level performance principles and testing standards.

The Junior Canes also partner with Strength Feed, a Raleigh-based performance training facility focused on strength, speed, and movement development.

Together, these partnerships provide athletes with high-level off-ice training resources that support their development as complete athletes.

MINDSET PERFORMANCE

The Junior Canes are placing an increased emphasis on mindset performance as an important part of athlete development. While physical training is essential, confidence, resilience, and the ability to perform under pressure are key elements of long-term player growth.

For the 2026-27 season, the Junior Canes are partnering with Sandy Cohen, founder of Mental Edge Hockey, to provide mindset training resources for athletes and families. Players will have access to live virtual sessions throughout the season covering mental preparation, confidence, emotional regulation, and responding to adversity, along with supporting educational materials. This initiative reflects the Junior Canes' commitment to developing complete athletes both physically and mentally.

CONCUSSION EDUCATION REQUIREMENT

Our program is committed to athlete safety and ongoing coach education. As part of this commitment, concussion education is required for all coaches. In partnership with Carolina Family Practice & Sports Medicine, three concussion education sessions will be offered throughout the 2026-27 season to ensure our coaching staff remains informed on the latest concussion recognition, management, and return-to-play protocols.

GIRLS SPORTS PSYCHOLOGY

Our 14U and older girls' teams work directly with a sports psychologist throughout the season to support the mental side of the game. These sessions help athletes build confidence and leadership while learning healthy ways to handle mistakes, losses, and challenging moments with coaches or teammates.

Players develop tools to manage game-day nerves, improve focus during practices and competition, and strengthen resilience after setbacks. The program also helps athletes build emotional control when frustrated or overwhelmed and provides a supportive space to talk about team dynamics and the social pressures that can come with competitive sports.

GOALIE DEVELOPMENT

To enhance our Goalie Development Program, instructors will attend weekly team practices to work with goalies in a team setting in addition to the instruction received during PD & VR sessions.

RESPECT - Show consideration for teammates, coaches, referees, opponents and fans.

PERSEVERANCE - NEVER GIVE UP.
